Repat Award

Congratulations must go to all the staff at Repatriation General Hospital: the hospital has won the Public Sector Leadership Award for Injury Prevention and Management.

Particular congratulations go to those who played leadership roles in the hospital's efforts to reduce both the number and severity of workplace injuries over the last decade. Initiatives, including the onsite physiotherapy treatment service, have helped deliver

above-average return to work and rehabilitation outcomes for hospital employees.

Approximately 700 people from throughout South Australia attended the SafeWork SA event. Judges from SafeworkSA, Business SA and SA Unions considered 42 entries, and then conducted site visits and examined workplace safety system documents in their assessment. The Repat is now a contender for the national awards to be announced in Canberra in early 2009. ■
